Description

Nagano Prefectural Azusagawa Senior High School was established as an agricultural school in 1910. Our school has since specialized in general education. Our core curriculum includes a well-rounded balance of Japanese, English, history, mathematics, and the sciences. Our programs are tailored to helping students prepare for admission to higher education or employment. In their second year, students must choose from an offering of elective courses in liberal arts, welfare and early childhood education, and information and business. This has been in effect since 2007.

Liberal Arts: Students in this course can take advanced classes in a variety of topics such as Japanese, English, mathematics, science, as well as the arts.

Welfare and early childhood education: Students are provided education in welfare and normalization. The curriculum includes topics such as sign language and practical training.

Information and Business: Students who choose these courses are provided with general knowledge about economics as a whole. The curriculum also includes material on the information and data needed to make business decisions.
