Aki は学校の課題で、2025 年 8 月 6 日に広島県で実施された平和式典の子ども代表による「平和への誓い」の英訳に取り組みました。以下はその英訳の一部とそれに関する会話です。文章を読み、あとに続く問いに答えなさい。

英訳の一部（本文）

Even today, wars are happening somewhere in the world.

Many people have lost their *loved ones and all hope about living.

We must think about this fact like our problem and care about peace.

We must *accept differences and try to understand others.

If we listen to other people, no one will be sad.

Small actions for the people around us may someday *lead to peace in the world.

One voice.

Even one voice can change something if we learn facts and believe our voice will be heard by someone.

Adults can, and we, the children, can also take action for peace.

Not to repeat *what happened on that day, not to repeat the history of Hiroshima, we will *pass on the wishes of the *hibakusha*, put people's voice together, and build peace together.

Conversation（会話）

Aki: I just read the passage. It says that wars are still happening today. I was surprised because sometimes I forget about that.

Ken: Yeah, me too. I feel sad when I think about people who have lost their family. That *makes me think I have to thank my life.

Yui: I agree. I also like the part about differences. If we try to understand people who are different from us, maybe we can stop fights early.

Aki: That's true. It also says even small actions can lead to peace. I think smiling at friends or helping someone is a small action, but it can help others do good things.

Ken: I like the line "One voice." If one person speaks, it can change something. I believe we, students, also have power.

Yui: Yes. Adults' action is important, but young people can act for peace too. For example, we can learn about history and share the facts we know.

Aki: Right. If we keep talking and caring about peace, maybe the world will change little by little.
